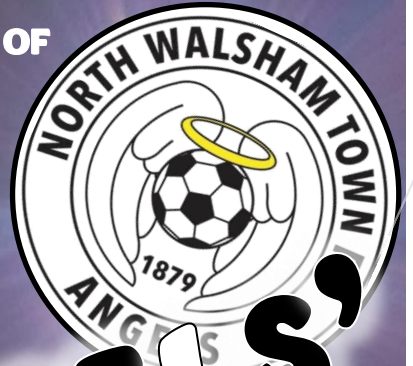

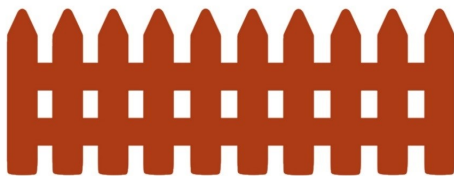
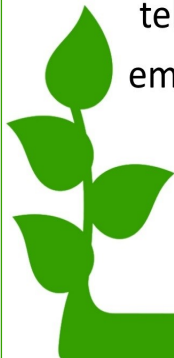

MENS FIRST TEAM REPORT v DERSINGHAM ROVERS

MENS RESERVES MATCH REPORT v MULBARTON WANDERERS RESERVES

A tough day at the office for the Reserves against a very decent outfit in the form of Mulbarton's Reserve team from the league above in the Junior Cup.

A goal down within 20 mins after another slow start didn't help to cause, failing to clear their lines resulted in the forward sliding the ball under the keeper. Back on level terms just minutes later, Gray looped a ball over the helpless keeper from outside the box, giving the home side a lifeline.

It's wasn't too long though before the away side were back ahead, with them then adding a further 2 goals added before half time, the last of which was of high quality with a pin point delivery deep into the box, impressively controlled & smashed home from many yards out.

On a wet day at greens road the development team hosted Reepham United in the league looking for a second win in a row and to gain some revenge following the 7-1 loss on the opening day of the season. 7 of the 14 players had played in that game and the performance today showed how far the squad has come in just 3 months.

Taking control early, Walsham worked hard to create the space to play their football and looking threatening in the final third. The opening goal came from a much more direct route as long ball from Wiseman was dummied by McGilway for Simmance to run onto. His ball across the box was controlled then calmly finished by Alexander.

Alexander returned the favour shortly afterwards, playing a through ball that Simmance converted after out battling the defender.

Walsham failed to press on following this though and Reepham got a deserved goal back before half time.

With conditions worsening, Walsham dug in during the second half, however had stand in keeper Wiseman to thank as he saved a penalty to keep Walsham ahead and that seemed to serve as a wake up call Walsham needed. They started to move the ball about and dominated the rest of the game. The final goal coming Simmance and Alexander pressured Reepham into a mistake on the edge of the box with the later finishing smartly.

Reepham did create one last opportunity to reduce the deficit but the evergreen Crabb was able to clear off the line. Final Score 3-1.

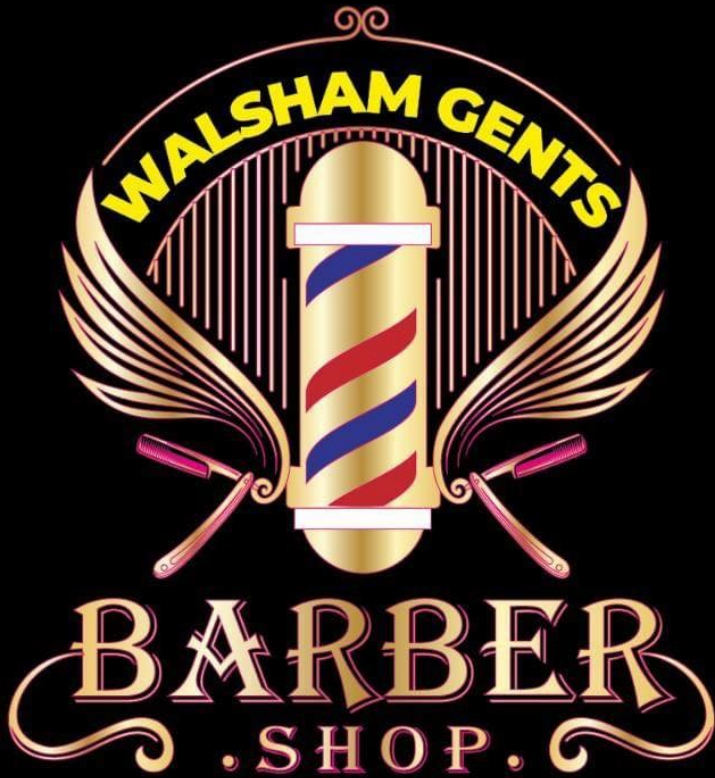

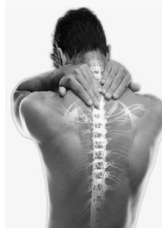

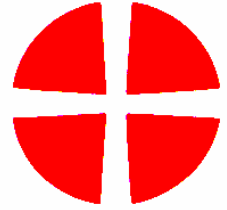

In & Around Football On This Date - 13th December

12th December 1953

Perhaps surprisingly for a club who have played in the Premier League but Wigan Athletic's highest home attendance was recorded in their pre-League days. On this day in 1953 the all non-league FA Cup 2nd Round match between Wigan and Hereford United at Wigan's former Springfield Road home attracted a crowd of 27,526. Wigan won 4-1 to earn a 3rd Round tie at Newcastle. Their best attendance at their current DW Stadium is 25,133 in a Premier League match against Manchester United in May 2008.

13th December 1930

Two high-scoring matches in the old First Division on this day in 1930 – Huddersfield 10 Blackpool 1 and Sheffield Wednesday 9 Birmingham 1.

13th December 1981

The Intercontinental Cup – played for by the winners of the European and South American Cup competitions to decide the unofficial world champs – never seemed a great priority for English clubs. Manchester United were beaten in the 1968 competition but Liverpool declined to take part after winning the European Cup in 1977 and 1978. But after beating Real Madrid in the 1981 European Cup final Liverpool played Brazil's Flamengo for the Intercontinental Cup at the National Stadium in Tokyo on December 13th 1981. A 62,000 crowd witnessed a poor performance by Liverpool with the South American champions recording a convincing 3-0 victory. In 2019 the same two clubs met in the final of an expanded and official World Club Cup competition, the Merseysiders winning that one 1-0.

13th December 1998

With Christmas fast approaching the half time entertainment at the Premier League match between Aston Villa and Arsenal included Santa parachuting down onto the Villa Park pitch. But the festive mood being enjoyed by the 40,000 Sunday evening crowd turned to tragedy when a gust of wind caused the RAF parachutist, Nigel Rogoff, to clip the edge of the Trinity Road stand and he then fell some 80 feet onto the side of the pitch. His badly broken legs were treated by two surgeons who had been spectators at the match and he went on to receive 177 pints of blood in a 3-month spell in hospital but sadly his injuries resulted in a leg being amputated. In February 2016 Nigel was part of a team of four rowers who became the first amputees to row the Atlantic - all 3000 miles of it!

13th December 2014

With a 3-0 victory over Luton Town in a League 2 match at the Globe Arena Morecambe became the first winners of a new bit of footballing silverware - the Eric Morecambe Trophy. Comedian Eric Morecambe was born Eric Bartholomew in 1926 and later took the surname of Morecambe after the town he was born in and grew up in. Having moved to the Luton area he became a genuine fan of Luton Town and for a number of years was a director of the Hatters. After his death the Queen unveiled a statue of him in Morecambe in 1999 which was sadly vandalised in 2014. Repaired, it was restored to its sea-front position on December 11th 2014 which was just two days before Luton visited Morecambe for a League fixture. To mark that occasion a miniature version of the statue was fashioned for the Eric Morecambe Trophy to be awarded to the winners of the future Morecambe v Luton encounters. Morecambe were the first victors with that 3-0 victory.

14th December 2019

Derby may have suffered a disappointing defeat at home to Millwall in the Championship but according to the Sunday Times they had the compensation of attracting a world record attendance to Pride Park for the match - 262,072. It must have been a tight squeeze as that's over 60,000 more than the previous record achieved at the Maracana Stadium in Brazil for the 1950 World Cup Final. Sadly it didn't make The Guinness Book of Records though as it proved to be a misprint in the Sunday Times. It should have been 26,272!

A View From The Middle

During this season we will be giving you insights into the game we love from a match officials point of view, this week we look at the consequences and actual Law around ball and hand / arm contact that regularly causes debate:

In the recent Nottingham Forest v Manchester United game there were appeals for handball when the ball struck the arm of Patrick Dorgu (Man Utd) as he swung his foot at the bouncing ball in the Nottingham penalty area (clearly an accidental contact) before the ball was headed out to Amad Diallo, who was just outside the penalty area, and struck an outrageous volley to score for Manchester United.



When analysing this incident, the ball had brushed the arm of the Manchester player as it travelled past him therefore this is not regarded as a deliberate play and play was correctly allowed to continue.

Although accidental this contact would have been penalised if the ball had immediately fallen to Dorgu and he had scored. This interpretation is what some fans struggle with, but the Law is quite clear.

Law 12 – Fouls and Misconduct - Handling the ball

For the purposes of determining handball offences, the upper boundary of the arm is in line with the bottom of the armpit. Not every touch of a player's hand/arm with the ball is an offence. It is an offence if a player:

- deliberately touches the ball with their hand/arm, for example moving the hand/arm towards the ball
- touches the ball with their hand/arm when it has made their body unnaturally bigger. A player is considered to have made their body unnaturally bigger when the position of their hand/arm is not a consequence of, or justifiable by, the player's body movement for that specific situation. By having their hand/arm in such a position, the player takes a risk of their hand/arm being hit by the ball and being penalised
- scores in the opponents' goal:
 - directly from their hand/arm, even if accidental, including by the goalkeeper
 - immediately after the ball has touched their hand/arm, even if accidental

The goalkeeper has the same restrictions on handling the ball as any other player outside the penalty area. If the goalkeeper handles the ball inside their penalty area when not permitted to do so, an indirect free kick is awarded but there is no disciplinary sanction. However, if the offence is playing the ball a second time (with or without the hand/arm) after a restart before it touches another player, the goalkeeper must be sanctioned if the offence stops a promising attack or denies an opponent or the opposing team a goal or an obvious goal-scoring opportunity.

Whilst the Law is quite clear handball has always been a great debating point between coaches and fans, however, there seems to be a general acceptance now within the game that officials are identifying handball offences more consistently especially when the arm is away from the body (in an unnatural position) and / or being used to make their body bigger.

The incidents which split opinion is when the player is not looking at the ball but their arm is above their head as they jump and makes contact with the ball. Whilst some argue the player has no idea where the ball is, the fact of the matter is that they take a risk in having their arm above their head and it cannot be denied that, whilst accidental, the arm has made their body bigger.....
